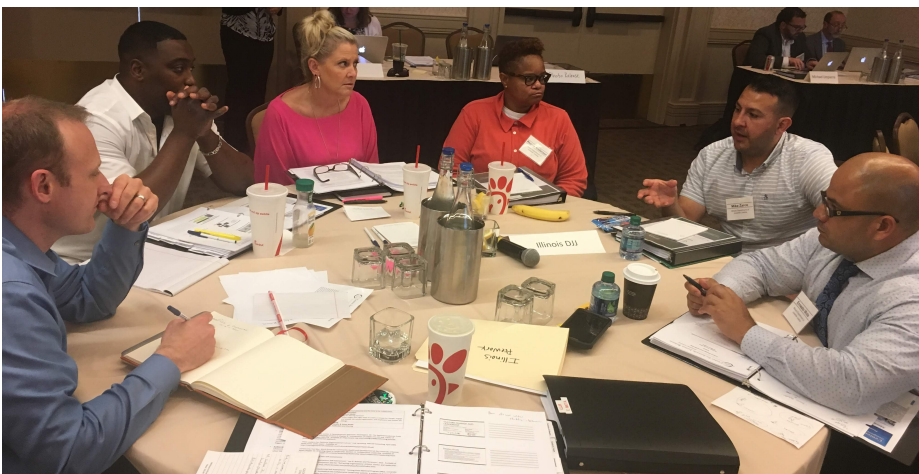
Some local reform efforts started as a result of Janet Reno Scholarships:

Youth in Custody

IL

The Certificate Program team from Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice is working to improve conditions of confinement for youth at the St. Charles facility, focusing on:

- 1) Reducing the use of confinement,
- 2) Increasing family engagement,
- 3) Increasing youth's access to educational services, and
- 4) Bolstering staff training.



School-Justice Partnerships and Diversion

OH

The Fairfield County, OH Certificate Program team plans to reduce the use of exclusionary discipline and referrals to the juvenile justice system through the creation and implementation of an Early Warning System and a Graduated Discipline Model.

Reducing Racial and Ethnic Disparities

NY

Leaders from Erie County, NY are planning to establish ongoing engagement and collaboration with community key stakeholders, cultivating resources for youth in the juvenile justice system, and reducing disproportionality for minority youth in placements.
